Seven Eleven was represented by Armand Keurian. This store, originally a Highs Dairy Store, opened at this center in the mid 1950s. Seven Eleven's renovation will include new exterior signage, store fixtures, and more shopper-friendly aisles.

What started out as an ice house in Dallas, Texas, back in 1927 has grown and evolved into the world's largest operator, franchisor, and licensor of convenience stores. Seven-Eleven operates, franchises, and licenses approximately 7,600 stores in the U.S. and Canada. Of the more than 6,500 stores the company operates and franchises in the United States, more than 4,900 are franchised. Outside of the U.S. and Canada, there are close to 34,900 7-Eleven and other convenience stores in Japan, Taiwan, Thailand, South Korea, China, Malaysia, Mexico, Singapore, Australia, Philippines, Indonesia, Norway, Sweden and Denmark.

Seven Eleven will reopen on December 10th at 2906 North Sycamore Street, *Arlington, Virginia 22207,* conveniently located near the East Falls Church Metro station in the Williamsburg Shopping Center (at the intersection of Sycamore and Williamsburg Blvd) in Arlington.
